### Dear friends of the Fondation EME,

I am very pleased to announce that the foundation continues to grow and innovate.

Indeed, the year 2022 was marked by several projects that aimed to have societal impact by involving a greater number of beneficiaries from very diverse backgrounds and including families, carers or support staff of the beneficiaries.

Inclusion and diversity are always at the forefront of our actions.

Developed in close collaboration with the people in charge of the institutions, all our projects now follow the same philosophy of living better together through music! As it would be impossible to tell you about all of our 29 projects, let me introduce the following:

Let it out: a project led by Paulo Lameiro at the prison in Schrassig. In addition to the hip hop workshops with the inmates within the prison, we managed to involve their families in the creative process. These highlights were captured in a series of video clips and a moving documentary.

**Grenzenlos Miteinander Gospel singen:** the creation of a choir led by Theresia Birngruber, bringing together people with multiple sclerosis and their relatives. This beautiful cross-border and intergenerational project brought together people from the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg and the Trier region

**Fluppdifipps:** an interactive opera composed by the Luxembourgish artist Martine Wallenborn for people with special needs.

The year 2022 was marked by many crises, including the war in Ukraine. To brighten up the daily life of some refugees, the Fondation EME organised several activities for them: concerts for newly arrived refugees at SHUK or in the hostels, provision of tickets for concerts at the Philharmonie, the Resist'dance project (choreographies with Ukrainian women) and private piano lessons for a young Ukrainian girl with obvious talent.

Finally, in order to organise and manage all these projects, the Fondation EME has grown. A multidisciplinary team of four people is now working to develop the projects.

# Projects of the Fondation EME



Every year, the Fondation EME offers and develops different projects for elderly or socially disadvantaged people, people with special needs and youth in distress in Luxembourg. In 2022, the Fondation EME organised 29 projects for approximately 17,000 people. In addition to these activities, we also aim to raise awareness through conferences on specific projects.

#### **Concerts EME**

Across Luxembourg, various institutions open their doors to professional musicians. Through high-quality concerts, listeners are offered moments of joy, artistic exchange and dignity

#### **Conferences**

#### Musique et sclérose en plaques

On Thursday 12 May 2022, the Fondation EME organised a conference on the subject of "Music and multiple sclerosis: the benefits of music". The MS Lëtzebuerg website states that "Multiple sclerosis (MS) is, after epilepsy, the second most common neurological disease in early and middle adulthood. It is the most common chronic inflammatory disease of the nervous system." Worldwide, up to 2.5 million people are officially diagnosed with MS, but because many people with MS have only minor disorders that cannot be diagnosed, the number of undiagnosed cases is probably higher.

Yet how can music be used in everyday life and as a leisure activity to support the well-being of people with MS? What positive effects can be observed in singing projects and how can a cultural offering influence the daily life of a participant?


The presentations were given by the physician Benoit Emeraux, who wrote his doctoral thesis on this topic in 2019, the singer Theresia Birngruber, as well as Nicola Kraus, occupational therapist at MS Lëtzebuerg (MSL) and Isabelle Cames, a member of the MSL board of directors.

#### **Training for musicians**

Our training programmes allow trainers with socio-cultural and musical backgrounds from Luxembourg and abroad to share their knowledge and skills. They are all actively involved in different programmes combining music and social change.

A training day with Martine Wallenborn will be offered on 3 March 2023, covering the impact of music on people with special needs and music and dementia. In addition, the musicians had the opportunity to interact with the music therapist and other speakers during a round-table discussion that closed the day.

#### REGULAR PROJECTS









#### Music in prison: how music projects can impact the resocialisation process.

What does music bring to prison? What are the challenges of music projects for prisoners and their families? How can we create social impact through arts and music?

During this conference with Paulo Lameiro, a Portuguese musicologist who organises music projects in prisons in Portugal, but also the artistic director of the Let it Out project at the prison in Schrassig and Dr. Annette Ziegenmeyer, a musicologist who has carried out a study on music projects in prisons in North Rhine-Westphalia, we discussed different topics related to music in prison and how music can help the resocialisation of prisoners by giving them new skills, confidence in themselves and in others.






# **D'Maus Kätti**Nadine Kauffmann Annick Sinner

With his unique sensitivity, both in human relations and musical practice, Robert Bodja teaches his "students" the basic techniques of the djembe, while practising the different rhythms in workshops, singing songs and learning to prepare for a concert. The result is a unique experience for all participants. Regardless of their age and origin, they leave their worries behind and just enjoy making music together.



During the All Saints' holiday, the young people of the Fondation Autisme Luxembourg discovered music through a journey into space. Combining contemporary music and jazz, the young people explored the sun and other planets in the company of the artists Christine Kristmann, Katharina Kramer and Gabriela Fragner. Accompanied by the double bass, the astronauts were able to let their imaginations run wild as they composed, improvising on the interaction of this beautiful instrument with their percussion instruments. The aim of the project is to combine calm and listening with music and movement.

Regardless of physical or mental ability, the tools of artistic activity are intuitively accessible to all. Thanks to the holistic and process-oriented working method of this project, everyone has the opportunity to participate in their own way and with their own individual approach, and to express themselves in a creative and varied way, regardless of their particular needs or communication patterns.

#### Co-creative rap music project

During the month of August, the inmates of the CPL Schrassig were able to participate in the "Let it Out" project. The project consisted in showing them the creative process of a song from A to Z, from the creation of the beat and the lyrics to the shooting of the video clip. The inmates ultimately created three songs: "Drill", "Boom Bap" and "Chill Song", each accompanied by a video clip, as well as a documentary about the whole project.

During this project, the families of the prisoners were also involved in the creative process. The artists were able to visit them and these enriching exchanges gave the project a new dimension.

## Projects for Ukrainian refugees

Since the outbreak of the war in Ukraine, the Fondation EME has been working to ease the lives of Ukrainian refugees who have arrived in Luxembourg by offering concerts at the emergency accommodation structure in Kirchberg since mid-March. These early concerts were organised in collaboration with the association "Ons Heemecht".

In April 2022, the Fondation EME called on Ukrainian musicians. Since then, we have been able to hire a pianist for EME concerts, a music theory teacher who teaches a Ukrainian girl at the Philharmonie and a choreographer with whom we organise the "Resist'dance" project.

In the summer, the Fondation EME was present in various Ukrainian refugee centres, offering concerts by various ensembles.

Since autumn, the Fondation EME has been organising outings to the Philharmonie for groups of refugees. Together with the supervisors, we offer guided tours and tickets to various classical concerts.

#### Resist'dance

#### Yurii Skobel

Resist'dance is a dance project in collaboration with neimënster created with the Ukrainian choreographer Yurii Skobel. The aim of the project is to give Ukrainian women the opportunity to present their country through a dance performance. 18 women trained for a month with Yurii Skobel and learned various traditional Ukrainian dances. After almost a month of workshops, the women presented their dances with Yurii in a show in neimënster. The show starts with a presentation of the traditional dance culture in Ukraine, with the aim of explaining to the audience the origin of the traditional dances before the dance show starts.

# Projects for People with medical conditions



#### Grenzenlos Miteinander Gospel singen

Theresia Birngruber

This cross-border project brought together people with multiple sclerosis from Luxembourg and Trier, as well as people from the German social project "Im Schammatdorf" and members of their families, friends and carers, to sing gospel. This inter-generational choir uniting people aged 12 to 80 wanted to break down barriers and give people the opportunity to sing in order to forget their occasionally difficult daily lives.

#### Musik fliessen lassen

Through music, conscious breathing, and different resounding objects, we manage to immerse ourselves in music and the right emotions. Trying to be overwhelmed by music occupies the mind, refocusing us on what is beautiful and allowing us to reach a deep calm and experience a pleasant body sensation.

A second edition of "Musik fließen lassen" took place in two stages this year. First, the musician trained the nursing staff and then went on site, singing in a group, breathing and practicing relaxation, in order to provide the participants with a sense of calm and well-being.

### Collaboration with the Kannerklinik

The Fondation EME is proud of its collaboration with the Kannerklinik (CHL). Music has beneficial effects on children; it can be a space for imagination, creation, listening and relaxation. The young patients in the children's psychiatric hospital benefit from music: it gives them the opportunity to interact with others, to communicate in a non-verbal way and regain self-confidence. Musical and physical expression projects are more than just a hobby.

Every school holiday, we offer different projects at the CHL. In addition to the concerts, the children have been able to enjoy a dance project with Elisabeth Schilling or the discovery of electronic instruments with Brave from BAMSS.

Since November 2022, the children have had the opportunity to make music with Brave once a week and to create a small end-of-year show for the other hospitalized children around the end of the year.

# EME - power youth

Since 2015, the Fondation EME has regularly offered workshops or concerts to various youth groups. From "Looss alles eraus", a project for children in psychiatric treatment, "Main Liewen, Mäin Danz", an intergenerational project, to "Tr\*ck It - the show must go on", the Fondation EME has gathered a lot of experience in developing innovative and interesting projects for young people.

Since the pandemic, young people are increasingly suffering and on the margins of society. Therefore, we have set up a programme called "EME-power youth" to encourage the development and support of young people in difficulty, offering them projects that give them confidence and creative stimulation.

In 2022 and 2023, "EME-power youth" consists of three major projects, two in juvenile psychiatry and one for classes "en voie de preparation" with various national and international artists.

#### Jus d'orange

In the summer of 2022, young people in the juvenile psychiatric unit of the Orangery3 of the CHNP were asked to create a song, write a text and develop a music video.

The participants were supported by an artistic team consisting of a beatmaker, Sacha Hanlet, known as ThemLights, a rapper, Forsan, the dancer Marc Folschette and a videographer, David Laplant. The mixing and mastering of the song was done by producer Vincent Habay, known as Taipan.

During the workshops, the young people were able to give free rein to their creativity and write texts representing them and their individual and collective experiences. Together, they wrote the song "La vraie vie" and were able to discover the process of creating a song and video clip, putting into words their experiences and feelings.

#### **Enchanted Entanglement**

During the Easter holidays, young people from the Robert Schumann Hospitals' juvenile psychiatry department explored the subject of global warming and the relationship of human beings with Planet Earth.

Through the notions of entanglement and enchantment, transgressing the idea of separation, and finding pleasure in humour, solidarity, thought, movement and music, the young people created two songs and two music videos.



### **CreativityLab: Treasured Times**

How is it possible to combine art, dance and music in one project? Elisabeth Schilling and young refugees from the LTC Annexe Kirchberg created an emotional performance inspired by the works of Lynette Yiadom-Boakye exhibited at Mudam.

Yiadom-Boakye's paintings seem both familiar and mysterious. Her portraits depict invented people exchanging looks, a key element in the artist's work. The moments communicated by the figurative paintings immerse the viewer in an imaginary world. Guided by this, the participants brought the characters to life with their bodies and individual creativity, letting their own memories and stories interact with the artworks.

#### **Sound in motion**

"The best version of me" - who do I really want to be deep inside? How can I accept myself physically, emotionally and mentally?

During the project, twenty young people suffering from addiction, eating disorders, emotional instability, personality disorders and depression from the inpatient wards and day clinic of the Robert Schumann Hospitals are immersed in the world of theatre, movement and emotions.

The "show-play" approach and live music allow them to experiment and be all the different versions of themselves. Through movement, voice and sound, these young people can give free rein to their creativity.

For a week, the young people are introduced to the world of theatre and music. They learn how to act, develop a better understanding of themselves and others and better knowledge of their bodies, and learn new ways of communication.

At the end of the project, the participants present their results for the nursing staff, their families and friends.

### **Tama**Robert Bodja

Under the leadership of percussionist Robert Bodja, two classes of the CSAE in Merl benefited from djembe workshops. During this project, the children learned to play the djembe and received music instruction. Through music, they were able to express themselves without language barriers, through rhythm and dance. Regardless of their age or nationality, Robert Bodja succeeded in captivating all participants and arousing their interest in the djembe, rhythm and music in general.

In addition, on 4 March 2022, the soprano Joyce DiDonato gave a concert at the Philharmonie de Luxembourg, and we were able to give three students from the "Tama" project the opportunity to participate in this concert. They met Joyce DiDonato and their parents were invited to the concert by the EME Foundation.

Following the workshops, the children also participated in the "Djammo Djammo" project and performed at the Philharmonie during the Fräiraum Festival.

In December 2022, the children of CSAE Merl will take part in the "Sang Mat" project, performing at the Grand Auditorium on the morning of 22 December 2022 for the closing of the "Sang Mat" project and in the evening at the EME Foundation's Benefit Concert.

As an intern at the Foundation since July, she does not only make cakes for the office. She creates all the visuals and content for the Fondation EME's social networks and newsletter.


