Dedicated to uniting people through music and promoting individual and collective well-being, we carried out 26 projects, reaching 17.500 beneficiaries from all walks of life. Developed in close collaboration with leaders of social and cultural institutions, our countless projects now follow the same philosophy of living better together through music! Nearly all of our resources are devoted to our **ongoing projects,** namely concerts in hospitals, care homes and institutions for people with specific needs. These projects continued throughout the year.

We also ran temporary projects, encouraging creativity and co-creation, such as **«Turtle Song**» for people with dementia; **«pOpera»**, a community opera project including refugees; and **«Wesch Side Story**», a project for young people in difficult circumstances, enabling them to express themselves through hip-hop. Participants become the main creators of their own production, for a truly transformative and inclusive experience.

In 2024, we'll be celebrating our **15th anniversary** with the inclusive, multicultural **«All Together**»project, open to anyone in Luxembourg who wants to sing together.

With the participation of 250 people from a wide range of partner establishments, including institutions for the elderly, the sick, people with specific needs and refugees, we will have choirs directed by Theresia Birngruber, and accompanied by 15 professional musicians.

Rehearsals will take place all over the country, culminating in a special concert on **6 July at 11 am at Kinnekswiss.** You are warmly invited to this great celebration! I would like to express my deep gratitude to several key people in the Fondation EME. First of all, I would like to extend my warmest thanks to our dedicated team and committed artists, without whom none of this would be possible.

I would also like to salute my colleagues on the Board of administration, whose ideas and active contribution are invaluable.



BRIDGES

'Bridges' is a collaborative initiative by the Philharmonie Luxembourg, the Fondation EME and the Croix-Rouge luxembourgeoise which offers free music instruments and classes to refugees from multiple centres across Luxembourg. By providing the tools and resources necessary to learn and make music, 'Bridges' seeks to create a safe and inclusive space for refugees to express themselves and form meaningful connections with others. Ultimately, 'Bridges' aims to showcase their musical talent, invite them into the Orchestre de la Place de l'Europe and thus demonstrate how people from various backgrounds and cultures can be brought together through the universal language of music.

The project revolves around three key action points:

1_ A Fundraising Concert: All proceeds from the 17.06.2023 concert featuring the Orchestre de la Place de l'Europe at the Philharmonie will be used to purchase a set of musical instruments. 2_ An Instrument Fund: The instruments will then be lent to the Fondation EME, who will curate a holistic programme including music tutorials, workshops, and masterclasses for refugees of all ages. The classes will be free of charge, and the instruments will be made available at no cost. Refugees who already have their own instruments will also be welcome to join.

3_ Joining Luxembourg's leading amateur orchestra: Finally, the participants of 'Bridges' will be gradually integrated into the Orchestre de la Place de l'Europe (OPE). The OPE is a classical orchestra that brings together amateur musicians from all backgrounds. By joining the OPE, refugees will have the opportunity to showcase their talents, perform at prestigious venues, and inspire others to embrace diversity and cultural exchange.

Through the 'Bridges' project, the Philharmonie Luxembourg and the Fondation EME will provide refugees with a means of artistic expression, socialisation, and inclusion. By creating a safe and supportive environment in which they can learn, create and heal, 'Bridges' will foster a sense of community, belonging, and hope.



5ªPunkada was born in the 1990s out of Fausto Sousa's dream of becoming a rock singer. As a beneficiary of an association fighting cerebral palsy, many thought that the severe cerebral palsy he suffers from would prevent him from realising his dream. But it was thanks to this association that he was able to form a group of musicians... Together, they recorded an album, <u>«Somos Punks ou Não?»</u>.

In May 2023, they were invited by <u>the groupe Coldplay</u> to perform with them in front of 50.000 people. The group is made up of two people with cognitive disabilities, two people with cerebral palsy and their music teacher. At the concert on 23 September, they were joined on stage by Big L on the road, aka Léandro, who also suffers from cerebral palsy and uses his music to combat everyday inequalities.

The project brings together rapper Maz and beatmaker Patrick Miranda (Pleasing) to run a series of workshops enabling participants to express themselves artistically and share their stories through music. Over the course of the ten workshops, participants will have the opportunity to write songs, create instruments and present their work at a performance at the Philharmonie.

By offering LGTBIQ+ refugees a creative platform to express themselves through music, the Empowering Voices project will not only empower individuals, but also contribute to a more inclusive and compassionate society. Through their songs and instruments, participants will share their stories, amplify their voices and inspire others to embrace diversity and support the LGTBIQ+ community.

Through djembe workshops, the children learned an instrument that instantly offered positive reinforcement, free from incorrect notes. These sessions provided a therapeutic escape, allowing the children to focus on self-expression. Their success led to public performances, including at an Up Foundation conference. Due to demand, workshops will continue, with upcoming events including a jam session at Vewa on July 22 and the Fête des Cultures in Dudelange on the weekend of October 30. 

They will choose the works of art, guide the Dadophonic artists in creating the texts and poems and write the music with Frin Wolter. The tours will then be offered to schools, institutions for people with special needs and care homes.

SUMMER AT CHNP

Once again, the EME Fondation will be organising a project for young people in hospital at Orangerie 3 of the Rehaklinik in Ettelbruck. In 2024, the young people will be at the heart of the creative process and will choose for themselves the project they would like to do.

RELAXED PERFORMANCES

On request, the EME Fondation organises relaxed concerts in one of the Philharmonie's rehearsal rooms for care homes. These concerts are led by professional musicians and follow the 'relaxed performances' methodology. The lighting is adapted, the doors remain open and the audience can give free rein to their thoughts and emotions.

ALL TOGETHER

The flagship project of the 15th anniversary of the EME Fondation! All Together will reunite a wide range of participants, including the elderly, people with specific needs, the socially disadvantaged and the sick, all through music. In each region, the EME Foundation is setting up choirs open to all. All the participants will come together at the end of the project for a concert at Kinnekswiss on 6 July 2024.

15____YEARS E M E

On the occasion of our 15th anniversary, we want to give a special place to our participants. This milestone symbolises a new beginning for the Fondation EME. Increasingly, our valued participants will become the main creators of their own musical creations, creating truly transformative and inclusive experiences through intergenerational and multidisciplinary projects.

With this in mind, in February 2024 we will be launching the 'All Together' project, open to all residents of Luxembourg who want to sing together.

With the participation of over 250 people from numerous partner establishments, including institutions for the elderly, the sick, people with specific needs and refugees, we will have eight choirs directed by Theresia Birngruber, accompanied by 15 professional musicians.

Rehearsals will take place all over the country, culminating in a special concert **on 6 July at 11am at Kinnekswiss**.
